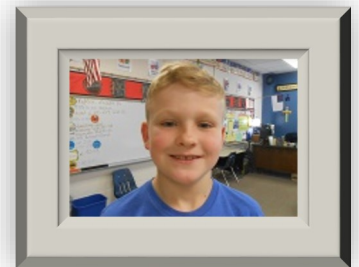

George Washington was often called "The Father of Our Country". After reading we did a workbook page on fighting for our freedom. On Friday in social studies we read about Franklin and Jefferson. Then we read about growth and change, the Louisiana Purchase, the corps of discovery, moving west, pioneer schools, the Civil war, Abraham Lincoln, growing into today's world, from ocean to ocean, and space exploration. Our vocabulary words are pioneer, civil war, territory, amendment, and immigrant. On page 212 William Clark and Meriwether Lewis explored the west with Sacagawea and York. On page 213 we saw a picture of Lewis and Clark's journey. Then we saw a picture of Sacagawea and her son Little Pomp. Last we did a workbook page.
