Memory Work-

Historical Wax Museum-

It won't be long before it's time for us to present our wax museum! The date is Thursday, February 8th from 12:30-1:15. You might want to mark your calendars now and tell your family and friends! Official invitations will be coming out in the New Year. We will be choosing our characters in several weeks. Please start thinking about 3-5 characters from history that you might like to portray in word and costume. It would be a good idea **not** to share these ideas with anyone so no one takes your idea! *When thinking about your character, please remember to think of individuals that have been a positive figure in our history. I don't want any characters that might be questionable in character.* If you have questions, please ask! This has been a very popular event in the years I have been doing this, and we look forward to it every year. More information will come. **Plan on having your selections ready by Tuesday, December 12th. We will choose our characters on that date.**

Reading-

We wrote a paragraph about the symbiotic relationship between bees and flowers concentrating on using supporting details to support and explain the main idea. We completed a project comparing texts from the unit and were introduced to adaptations.

English-

We identified and used singular and plural pronouns as well as subject, object, and possessive pronouns.

Religion-

We recalled God's judgment and mercy in the events of Israel's journey to the Promised Land. We discussed how God in Christ leads us daily to leave sins behind and enter the new and eternal life He provides. We reviewed the story of the call of Gideon and discussed how he showed himself to be a hesitant, unlikely choice. We talked about how Christians today can easily fall into the same kinds of feelings about not feeling qualified or willing to carry out a part in God's kingdom. We were reminded though that we can be God's servants in many ways.

Social Studies-

This week we discussed the geography and natural resources of the Northeast. We will take the first states test on Wednesday. See the information and states on the following page.

Geography Bee-

This week the 4th graders participated in a classroom geography bee. A school wide bee will be held in January for kids in grades 4-8. The 4th graders who will represent our class are Ava and Gabe. Jordan will stand by as the alternate. Congratulations!

Science-

This week we discussed how a sudden change in one group of organisms (plants or animals) can affect another group of organisms.

Math-

We subtracted three digit numbers with regrouping and found missing factors in multiplication problems. We rounded numbers to estimate and added and subtracted decimal numbers. Yesterday we started multiplying two-digit numbers, and today we used the Associative Property to solve problems involving parentheses. We named line segments using two points on a line and used symbols to identify line segments. The next math test will be Monday.
