Second Grade Curriculum Overview

Biblical Studies

Second graders learn of the events and the lives of many people from both the Old and New Testaments as they grow in their understanding of how God keeps His promise to always be with them. The lives of these people also set important examples of how God wants His children to live. Emphasizing the life of Jesus, the children continue to learn of God's greatest gift – His only Son. Language Arts

The language arts program is designed to provide students with many opportunities to interact in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Reading is taught by building upon and expanding the strong phonetics foundation, skills for decoding, and comprehension developed in first grade. The reading text which serves as the core program is enriched with carefully selected literature. The writing process emphasizes appropriate grammar, composition and spelling.

Language Arts Texts are: Wonders by McGraw-Hill and Saxon Phonics

Mathematics

Using a variety of manipulative and hands-on strategies, second graders master the addition and subtraction facts and apply this mastery to computing two and three place numerals requiring re-grouping. Students develop skills in estimating, telling time, measuring, graphing, and computing money, and they expand their understanding of the concepts of fractions and geometry. Problem-solving is emphasized throughout all units of study.

Social Studies

Second grade students learn about our country's government, community and state government and our leaders. Second graders use map and globe skills to study the world regions and learn about world resources and our changing environment. Early America, heroes and holidays, world culture, producers and consumers, and barter and trade, are other topics of study in the second grade social studies curriculum.
