First Grade Curriculum Overview

Biblical Studies

Centering on the immediate world of the six-year-old, this course begins by establishing the special relationship that God has with those who are His children. As students learn about the life of Jesus and His special people described in the Bible the children grow in their understanding of how God shows His love to His people and how we can show our love to Him by loving and forgiving others. Memory work is assigned weekly. The **text used** is *One in Christ*, Concordia Publishing House.

Language Arts

The language arts program is designed to provide support for building a strong reading foundation. It combines research-based instruction with new tools to meet today's challenges. It incorporates both print and digital media to provide instructional support, finding and using text evidence, engaging in collaborative conversations, and writing to sources. The reading series and phonics program combined are enriched with carefully selected literature and the writing process using appropriate grammar, composition and spelling.

The texts used are McGraw-Hill Reading Wonders and Saxon Phonics.

Mathematics

By using a variety of manipulatives and hands-on learning strategies, first graders learn to fluently add and subtract: facts within ten, facts to twenty, and two-digit addition and subtraction using place value. Understanding patterns and grouping according to similarities and differences are important concepts of math at this level, as well as understanding the place value of our number system. Activities also develop the student's understanding of time, measurement, money and real life problem-solving. As the year progresses, the children are introduced to the value of fractions, and the concept of less than one whole. (Text: enVision Mathematics

Social Studies

As God's children, students learn the importance of being part of a community and interacting in Christian love with those around them. Concepts students will learn are: rules, laws and citizenship; symbols of our country; changes in people's lives from long ago; how God created us different yet similar; and how money is used in a community. In First Grade, students also broaden their understanding of the state in which they live, and Kansas history and culture supplement the learning in this program. Map skills are introduced and enrich the learning by providing visual relationships to certain locations.

Class activities for the Social Studies program also integrate literature and emphasize the writing process throughout the year, as well as, music, choral reading, finger plays, dramatizations, role playing, story-telling, audio-visuals, and field trips. The **text used is** *A Child's View*, by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt School Publishers.

Science

The First Grade Science program emphasizes the process of investigating and solving problems in science. Observing, creating models, collecting and interpreting data, inferring, predicting, experimenting and formulating hypothesis are skills stressed in all activities as the students study Physical, Life and Earth Sciences as well as Science, Engineering and Technology skills.

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The First Grade Science program is an innovative, standards-aligned, hands-on curriculum that teaches children how to think like scientists.
