In relationship to God

Fourth Grade Curriculum Overview

Biblical Studies

The religion program presented in *One in Christ* is a chronological study of bible stories beginning with the creation of the world. Its emphasis is to help the students know the one true God and the forgiveness and salvation offered through Jesus' death and resurrection and grow into Christian maturity. Each lesson centers on the cross of Christ and is grounded in the Word of God through which the Holy Spirit works to create, strengthen and sustain saving faith. The text used is *One in Christ*, by Concordia Publishing House.

Language Arts

The language arts program is designed to provide students with many opportunities to explore reading, writing, speaking and listening. The text used for language arts is *Wonders by McGraw-Hill*. Each week a new concept is introduced that includes grade appropriate topics including science and social studies. Lessons include comprehension, strategies and skills in reading and writing, genre, vocabulary, and writing. This program also allows for differentiation in small group instruction, research and inquiry and writing. Grammar and Spelling are also included in the *Wonders* curriculum. In addition to the grammar introduced and used in the Wonders curriculum, we supplement with *Grammar*, *Usage*, and *Mechanics: Conventions of Standard English* by Zaner-Bloser

Mathematics

EnVision Mathematics implements focus, coherence, and rigor in the program. The program is organized to help students focus on clusters of related content within the grade, progress in mathematics across grades, and understand concepts, gain procedural skill and fluency, and gain skills to prepare for college and careers. Fourth grade topics include place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, problem solving, fractions and decimals, units of measure, and geometry concepts. The text used is *Savvas Envision Mathematics*

Social Studies

In fourth grade students investigate the different geographical regions of the United States. Students learn that God's creation is a blessing, and all that God has created must be treated responsibly. As the students investigate the environments, climates, cultures, and people, they learn how each of these interact and affect each other. Growing in their understanding of how people's lives reflect the environment in which they live, the students connect them with other societies and cultures from other societies globally.

Skills in using maps, globes, time lines, and graphs are expanded and become important skills to be used in many areas of learning. The text used is *States and Regions* by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt.

Science

The science program in fourth grade is divided into three components: life science, earth and space science, and physical science. Mystery Science will be used to help students nurture their curiosity and learn about the world around them by listening, observing, sharing, writing, and learning to figure things out for themselves. Lessons will include topics such as the human body, earth's features and processes, sound, and energy. Mystery Science will be enhanced using additional videos and reading materials including Generation Genius as well as others. The goal is to have the students grow up and experience the amazing world we live in created by God, full of possibility and wonder.
